FARMWORKER REALITY TOUR

Tour Leaders: Dr. Ann Lopez, Professor and Author, *The Farmworkers' Journey*. Richard Hobbs, immigration attorney & Executive Director of Human Agenda.

Participants will develop a better understanding of the working conditions of Mexican farmworkers in Northern California. At the Buena Vista Migrant Labor Camp near Watsonville farmworkers will show their living quarters. Also they will give their testimonies on their working conditions and the challenges their children encounter in receiving education. Additionally, the tour leaders will share recent information on farmworkers including demographics, globalization prospects for immigration reform, and ending the 50-mile rule that forces parents to take out their children from school. Afterwards, participants will head to Salinas to a farmworker house for dinner and more testimonies. Lastly, Ann Lopez will sign copies of her book, *The Farmworkers' Journey*.
